What do we expect from you?

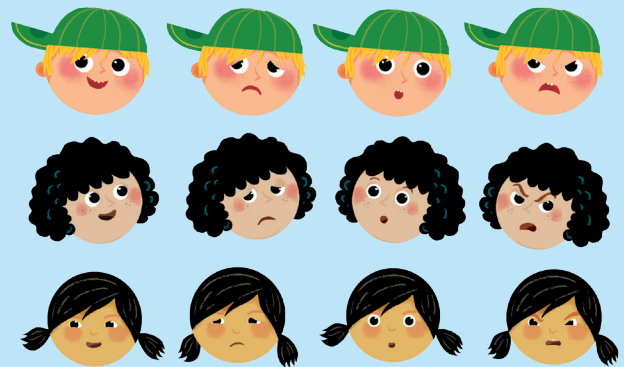

Most children behave differently at school than at home

Things are different at school than at home, which is why we often see different behaviours. Such differences are interesting: what makes your child able to do something at home and not yet at school, or the other way around? If we solve the puzzle together, we can come up with new ideas.

We prefer not to wait too long before discussing any concerns, and we hope that parents will also raise any issues in a timely manner. Because you know your child best, and the longest, please share your experiences so that we can understand your child better and come up with good solutions.

We should think along with each other, but should try to switch places ...

We want to offer each other suggestions. As teachers are in charge of the classroom, they decide what to do about parents' tips. At home, parents are in charge, and they decide what to do about any tips from school. It's important that we talk about what we're trying to do, to avoid any misunderstandings. We will also make clear agreements and follow them up later.

We're respectful when we talk about each other in front of children

Trust between the school, parents and children is important. When your child notices that their parents and teachers get along, it makes them feel safe. This is why it's important that we act respectfully towards each other.

What if your child comes home from school feeling angry or sad?

Of course, we understand that this will also affect you as a parent. Support your child ('I can see that you are angry/sad, that must be tough for you'), and try to stay calm ('I don't really understand why your teacher did that. I'll ask them about it'). You may sometimes disagree with a teacher, which is completely normal. Please discuss this with the teacher, and don't burden your child with this.

If you want to find out more about working together with the school, please ask the principal if you can borrow the book *Met plezier naar school!* (Happy at school!), which contains many practical tips for parents.

Your child's voice is of great value!

When children tell us what they are happy with, as well as what they want done differently and how, this information helps us in our teaching. If your child tells you something important about the school, please let us know and we'll address it.

Are we doing a good job? Does your child come home feeling happy? Did they enjoy a particular lesson? Please let us know! It's important for us to know that we're doing a good job so we can continue doing the right things.
